



What is Markdown?

 Markdown is markup language (like HTML) made for quickly writing up readable documents

- Markdown and HTML
 - Markdown renders out to HTML
 - Markdown can contain HTML
 - Markdown is a superset of HTML!
- It's most prevalent in the Git repository community
 - Commonly used for README files and Wiki pages

What Makes Markdown Special?

 Even in it's raw form, markdown is very readable with minimal clutter

- Supports code syntax highlighting for various languages
 - Depending on individual implementations
- Easy to learn
 - Easier than HTML alone!
- Example File: readme.md

Flavors of Markdown

- As mentioned before, rendering of Markdown depends on where it's viewed. Renders exist for Eclipse, Visual Studio, GitHub, GitLab,
 - They are **mostly** the same, but differ in image support, language code highlighting support, etc.

 You can, however, always guarantee readability, even without a renderer.
